East Anglia West Fisheries Update

The following document provides LOFFCA members and anglers with up to date area fisheries news together with details of our recent activities.

2018 fisheries monitoring programme:

- Currently 62 sites in total scheduled for surveying in 2018, (see Appendix 1).
- As always the actual number of sites surveyed is subject to change.

Fisheries enforcement update:

- Across the Great Ouse catchment, 2277 rod licences were checked between April and December in 2017.
- Of these 2277 checks 2232 were 'new checks'.
- In total 77 offence reports issued.
- The bailiffs are more than happy to carry out rod licence checks at fisheries with club officials, if your keen to accompany the bailiff please get in contact (chris.middleton@environment-agency.gov.uk or 07881 512038) and I'll provide the bailiffs contact details.

Fisheries improvement programme (FIP):

- Please keep the potential habitat enhancement/fish passage projects coming through, click here for further information or contact me directly on chris.middleton@environment-agency.gov.uk
- We are hoping to film some of the angling club FIP projects in 2018. Towcester & District AA have agreed to let us film their Astwell Mill Restoration Project following the clubs successful £4,000 bid.
- The process will involve collecting pre, during and post enhancement works footage and if we have a
 willing volunteer from the club we'd also like to record a piece to camera. The video will be hosted on
 the EA social media pages.
- Anyone wishing to feature in any of our films would need to sign an Environment Agency photo and video consent form.

Incident response:

- Usually a dedicated Fisheries Officer is on call 24/7 between April and September to respond to
 incidents involving fish. However, due to several dry winters and the prolonged dry weather period it's
 been decided to extend this duty roll for the full 12 months until further notice.
- If you see dead or distressed fish please call the incident hotline number immediately on 0800 807060 or the fisheries duty officer directly on 07747 038283.
- We plan to carry out a fish removal during February from the river Lark in Bury St Edmunds through the Abbey Gardens stretch. This section of river has historically suffered from low dissolved oxygen levels and we've had to dose hydrogen peroxide on multiple occasions in the past to prevent significant fish mortalities. As the long-term weather forecast is not looking great this situation is likely to become worse and more frequent, therefore we've taken the decision to carry out a proactive fish removal as regular peroxide dosing is not sustainable. When last surveyed, some very large roach and dace were caught. All captured fish will be transported downstream and restocked around the Hengrave area where habitat and water quality is more favourable and should provide some good sport for the visiting angler. We plan to film the operation and create a video in due course.

2017/18 winter work programme:

- Two cropping jobs scheduled for January.
- Monday 15th January Kingfisher Lake (health check sample).
- Monday 22nd January Nunnery Lakes (health check sample).
- Providing the silver fish pass the mandatory health check, the fish cropping/restocking will occur on:
- Monday 29th January Kingfisher Lake
- Monday 5th February Nunnery Lakes
- The fish will be offered to angling clubs who have expressed an interest and to those within a suitable travelling distance from the source water. Alex Malcolm (S&C Fisheries Officer) will be in contact in due course to notify the successful clubs and to arrange access.
- We plan to film these operations and create a video showing the whole process including; the health sample collection netting, the fish dissection at Brampton and why this is important and then the follow-up netting and subsequent restocking. As with the FIP filming we'd also like to film a member of the angling club on camera at the receiving water.
